As we close another remarkable year, I extend my heartfelt gratitude to each of you who has supported Empower Mali's mission. Your unwavering commitment has allowed us to make a meaningful impact in the lives of countless individuals across Mali. Together, we have transformed challenges into opportunities, creating lasting change in communities that need it most. This year, through collaboration with our dedicated partners, we have successfully implemented numerous projects aimed at improving education, health, and access to clean water:

Education Initiatives

- Dambe Kalanso School Expansion (Oueléssébougou): Added three new classrooms with support from JP Peace Love and Happiness Foundation.
- Dambe Kalanso School Additional Classrooms (Oueléssébougou): Added six additional classrooms with funding from Maxfield Foundation.
- Dambe Kalanso Administration Building (Oueléssébougou): Laid foundation for administrative offices with support from Stirling Foundation, Maxfield Foundation, and Mellor Foundation.
- Empower Mali School Completion (Labata): Completed our three-classroom middle school, equipped with desks and sanitation facilities, with funding from B.H. Roberts Foundation.
- Laptops for Top Students: Donated 10 laptops to outstanding students, funded by National Speakers Association Foundation.
- Notebooks for Orphaned Students (Tombouctou): Provided 5,000 notebooks to orphaned children, supported by David Kelby Johnson Memorial Foundation.
- Teacher Housing (Oueléssébougou): Built housing for teachers, ensuring retention of quality educators, with funding from Building Youth Around the World.

Clean Water Projects

- Solar-Powered Water System (Kapelegue): Installed a sustainable water system with support from The Giving Cookie (Katie Pearce) and Namaste Solar Foundation.
- Solar-Powered Water Systems (Misseni & Kafigueba): Installed water systems serving thousands, funded by Charles Lamar Family Foundation.
- Ten Solar-Powered Water Systems (Multiple Rural Communities: Pogosso, Pakasso, Zangosso, Zanpedougou, Yirimadjo, Tessalit, Zidiangolodougou, Stade Malien, Tiecourala, and Sikasso town): Partnered with Stirling Foundation to install clean water access points across Mali.
- Solar-Powered Water System (Dissan): Installed a sustainable water system with donations from Hope for a Better World Foundation and Rocky Woods Charitable Foundation.
- Solar-Powered Water System (Kokan): Brought accessible

- water closer to the community, thanks to Sorenson Legacy Foundation.
- Solar-Powered Water System (Fanidiama): Brought accessible water closer to the community, thanks to Gerber Construction.

Community and Women Empowerment

Communal Cooking Pots for Women (Oueléssébougou):
 Distributed 50 large cooking pots to support community events, funded by Peace Love and Happiness Foundation.

Healthcare

 Life-Changing Surgeries for Children (Oueléssébougou and Surrounding Regions): Provided 33 children with critical surgeries through Building Youth Around the World and Clinique de Paix.

Scholarships

- Leadership Program: Funded scholarships and leadership training opportunities for Malian students, thanks to JP Peace Love and Happiness Foundation.
- Scholarships for Malian Students at Nomen Global (USA): Sponsored Mamadou Samake and Azidane Ag to study English and further education, funded by Peace Love and Happiness Foundation and Nomen Global.

Each of these accomplishments represents the generosity and compassion of our donors, partners, and volunteers. The resilience and determination of the Malian people continue to inspire us, and it is our privilege to stand beside them, providing the tools and opportunities they need to thrive.

Empower Mali believes that the citizens and communities of Mali have the right to become self-reliant.

The focus of the foundation is not to give a handout to these communities, but rather to work side by side empowering these communities to meet their own needs by sharing with them the resources and tools to get it done.

We commit our resources and efforts to affect change in the areas of:

- Education: Empower Mali supports education in Mali by building and renovating schools, providing school supplies and materials, and funding teacher salaries. The foundation also offers scholarships to students who otherwise wouldn't have access to education.
- Healthcare: Empower Mali partners with local healthcare providers to improve access to healthcare services in Mali. The foundation supports the building of clinics, training of healthcare workers, and providing medical supplies and equipment.
- Clean Water: Empower Mali helps to provide clean water to communities by building wells, water pumps, and water treatment systems. The foundation also educates communities about proper water management and sanitation practices.
- Clean Energy: Empower Mali supports the use of clean energy in Mali by building solarpowered systems for homes, schools, and clinics. The foundation also provides training on the maintenance and repair of these systems.

In all these domains, Empower Mali works closely with community leaders and citizens to ensure that projects are sustainable and can continue even after Empower Mali leaves the village. The foundation focuses on empowering communities to take charge of their own development and to create a better future for themselves and their children.

Empower Mali is fighting against illisteracy, poverty and limited access to basic amenities. We emphasize working closely with the citizens in the areas we serve. We believe when equipped with the correct tools and resources, Malians will be empowered to help themselves and their families escape the throes of poverty.

OUR STRATEGIES TO EMPOWER SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



1. LOCAL INITIATIVE

As part of our partnerships, we expect the Malian communities where we work to initiate the demand for the project and also to contribute to the project whether it is 20% of the cost of the project and/or land or labor.

2. EMPOWERMENT

We utilize the existing capacities and resources of the villages.

3. PARTNERSHIP

The collaboration with the government and community stakeholders ensures that our projects are adequately staffed and receive long-term sustained support.

By getting the communities involved in both the needs assessment and financial portion, the project becomes self sustainable. The villagers are more likely to maintain the project because of their own investment and role in bringing the project to their community.

- 18 schools serving 150+ children each year built in the rural villages of Ferekoroba, Dongorona, Falla II, Katele, Dovong, Fanterela, Marako, Koumantou Banko, Moro-Moro, Zekoun, Ouelessebougou, Karagouan, Siemen, Pogosso, Badalabougou Pre-School, Sibiribougou, Kankrougou and Labata
- In progress construction of Dambe Kalanso Educational Institution of Oueléssébougou: 21 classrooms completed
- 9 blocks of three 2-room Teacher housing for teachers and directors in the villages of Ferekoroba, Dovong, Fanterela, Dongorona, Siemen, Karagouan, Moro-Moro, Zekoun and Ouelessebougou.
- As part of the food security initiative, six tractors to farmer co-ops in the villages of Beneko, Bougouni town, San town, Garalo, Sikasso town and N'Tentou
- Two Electricity generating playgrounds with battery packs and 40 solar lanterns in the villages of Fanterela and Ferekoroba;
- 200 Luci Lights and soccer balls distributed to the villages of Marako, Dongorona, Beneko, Kolena and Dovong
- 500 Days for Girls feminine hygiene kits donated and distributed.
- 45 solar water pumps serving tens of thousands installed in the communities of N'Tentou, Ouelessebougou, Sibleni, Baguineda, Bougouni N'Godonina, Quartier Tripano, Dioila, Sanankoro Djitoumou, Bougouni N'Dogonina, Kabalcoro Baguineda, Sibleni, Kontoumoun, Madina, Hameau de Moro-Moro, Sangarebougou Guereboukin, Bandjougoubougou Niena, Quartier Mali, Badalabougou, Oueléssébougou School, Dioila II, Oueléssébougou City Soccer Field, Samanko Kolondieba, Guaranko, Manabougou, Koulouba Sibleni, Tiemba, Dogotou Lecko, Bomboty, Bogoda Kassaro, Zangosso, Kokan, Pogosso, Kapelegue, Misseni, Kafigueba, Pogosso, Pakasso, Zangosso, Zanpedougou, Yirimadjo, Tessalit, Zidiangolodougou, Stade Malien, Sikasso town, Tiecourala, Dissan.
- Textbooks in all subjects for six schools: BYAW Academy of Ferekoroba, Micah Shea Watkins Academy of Dongorona, Coates Academy of Falla II, Peace Love Happiness Academy of Moro-Moro, Coates Academy of Siemen and BYAW Academy of Karagouan. Each school serves 150 students each year.
- 100 Tablets donated in 16 impoverished middle schools in Kalabancoro, Bamako.
- Chromebooks for the top ten achievers of the 9th grade exams (DEF) in Mali.
- 22 four-year high school scholarships to the Wasatch Academy High School, Mt.
 Pleasant, Utah
- 1 three-year university scholarship to an Agricultural School at Fundacion Paraguay in Paraguay
- 8 English language Scholarships for Malian students to study English at Nomen Global in Provo, Utah
- A Conference Center in Ouélessébougou
- A water purification system for the village of Dongorona
- Funding for a Chicken Egg farm which has created jobs and a source of fresh food.
- A Basketball Court in KalabanCoura



Addition of 3 classrooms to the Dambe Kalanso school in Ouelessebougou: Last year, the JP Peace Love and Happiness Foundation funded 9 classrooms of our Dambe Kalanso school projected. A generous donation allowed us to add 3 more classrooms. The establishment of this unique school building in the community of Ouelessebougou is specifically tailored to create an environment that is conducive to molding the future leaders of Mali. At this school, we will institute a Mali's national curriculum requisites s a curriculum that not only imbues our students with the academic knowledge they need, but also the character required to lead and make an impact in their society.









Began construction on 6 new Classrooms for Dambe Kalanso, Oueléssébougou: Thanks to a generous donation from the Maxfield Foundation, we are expanding Dambe Kalanso school with six new classrooms. This school is designed to nurture the future leaders of Mali by providing an environment that fosters both academic excellence and strong character. By integrating Mali's national curriculum with values-based education, we aim to equip students with the knowledge, skills, and leadership qualities needed to make a lasting impact in their communities and beyond.





Supporting Women with Communal Cooking Resources: In celebration of Women's Day and thanks to our partner Peace Love and Happiness Foundation, we purchased and distributed 50 large communal cooking pots and serving spoons to Ouelessebougou and its neighboring villages. It was uplifting to witness the joy of the women in these communities. Every day, they face challenges in preparing large meals for important village events. With these new pots, they no longer need to travel long distances to the main city to rent themsaving both time and transportation costs. This initiative was truly meaningful and will have a lasting impact on each community.









Middle School Completed in Labata:

We are proud to announce the completion of our newest school in the village of Labata, located in the Commune of Gnouman Makan. For years, Labata's children have studied in extremely difficult conditions, but thanks to the generous support of the B.H. Roberts Foundation, we have brought lasting change to this community. The new school features three fully equipped classrooms, a director's office, a storehouse, and six toilets (three for boys and three for girls), providing a safe and supportive learning environment for generations to come.









Laptops for Top Students: To reward excellence and inspire students to reach new heights, Empower Mali donated 10 laptops to the top-performing 9th-grade students in Mali. These laptops, funded by the generous support of the National Speakers **Association Foundation**, were awarded alongside a \$200 cash gift to recognize the students' hard work and their families' dedication to education. By celebrating their success on the DEF exam (Diplôme d'Études Fondamentales), we aim to motivate and empower the next generation of leaders in Mali.










Empowering Future Leaders: With the support of the JP Peace Love and Happiness Foundation, we are investing in the next generation of Malian leaders. This leadership program provides vocational training for women groups in Mali and also scholarships for students to study in the U.S., training opportunities, and initiatives designed to foster personal and professional growth. By equipping young minds with the skills and education they need, we are helping to shape the future leaders of Mali.











Teacher Housing in Ouelessebougou:
Attracting qualified teachers to rural
Mali can be challenging, but with the
support of Building Youth Around the
World (BYAW), we've made

significant strides.

Thanks to BYAW's generous donation, we were able to build teacher housing for the Karl and Erika Michel Academy in Oueléssébougou.
This project provides multiple teacher families with comfortable homes, each featuring two bedrooms and a living room, helping to ensure a stable and dedicated teaching staff in the community.







Notebooks for Tombouctou: With literacy rates as low as 31% in Mali, orphans-especially in the insecure northern regions-face even greater challenges in accessing education. In partnership with the local organization ASSOS (Association for the Support of Orphans in the Sahel), Empower Mali provided 5,000 notebooks to orphaned students in the urban municipality of Tombouctou. This initiative, made possible through the generous support of the David Kelby Johnson Memorial Foundation, helps ensure that these children have the resources they need to continue their education and build a brighter future.













































FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS
